# KINDERGARTEN AND PRE PRIMARY

Pemberton DHS has established a tradition of providing quality education tailored to meet the individual needs of our children. Pemberton DHS begins at Kindergarten through to Year 10.

We are committed to providing a quality educational program that is inclusive of all children. We believe that young children are active learners who construct their own understandings and knowledge of the world. We use a range of teaching practices to support and enhance children's learning and development.



The children will be engaged in learning experiences based on the West Australian Curriculum, the Early Years Learning Framework and the Kindergarten Curriculum Guidelines. These experiences allow them to construct, manipulate, explore, discover, test and practice their developing knowledge. A balance between child-initiated and adult-supported experiences is provided, and children are enabled to assert themselves and their independence.

# *Developing Partnerships*

## Kindergarten

The Kindergarten days for 2025 will be Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday ('odd' weeks) and Monday and Tuesday ('even' weeks) from 8.30am to 3.00pm. Please refer to the Term Planner for specific dates.

## Settling into Kindergarten

Some children need reassurance to settle into the routines and expectations of Kindergarten, while others throw themselves whole-heartedly into the program, embracing every aspect. Please be assured that we will contact you if your child requires extra support.

## Pre-Primary

Pre-Primary sessions are compulsory, five days per week. If your child is absent from school, please let the Front Office know the reason for our attendance records. It is especially important to establish and maintain positive attendance from Kindergarten, throughout Pre-Primary, and all of their school years. Any absences, means they are missing essential learning which only takes place in face-to-face learning environments.

## Our Vision

## Arrival and Departure

A Parent or Carer must accompany children to their classroom at the beginning of each day. The door will open at 8.30am for both Kindergarten and Pre-Primary. We welcome parents and caregivers to stay and participate in activities with their child until they are settled or the bell rings at 8:45am to signal the start of the day. If your child takes the bus, they will be collected from and taken to the bus each morning and afternoon by a senior student.

If someone other than yourself is to collect your child, notify the school and this adult must sign in at the Front Office.

Similarly, if you need to collect your child early, please attend the Front Office and sign your child out of the school.





## Parent Meetings

If you have any concerns, please request a meeting with your classroom teacher to arrange a suitable time.

## Kindergarten Uniform

School uniform is not compulsory, but is recommended. All clothing should be named, including shoes, jumpers, bags and hats. Please dress your child in comfortable, easily washed clothes; aprons are provided for messier activities. Clothes that allow free movement, are not too tight, too loose or too long and allow children to play safely and go to the toilet independently, are the most appropriate. We recommend enclosed shoes for physical activities and when moving around the school. No thongs please.

## Pre-Primary Uniform

Pre-Primary is compulsory schooling so children must be dressed in full school uniform. Please refer to the school website for a copy of the school's Dress Code.



## Crunch n' Sip

Please provide a small container of fresh fruit or vegetable for Crunch and Sip. This fruit needs to be cut up and placed in a small container. This is an individual snack and is not shared with others. Please keep staff informed of any food allergies or intolerances your child may have.

## Healthy Lunchboxes

Student health care is most important. Together we can promote good health habits early in your child's life. We would appreciate you supporting us by providing your child with a healthy lunchbox and also talking to your child about healthy food choices. Please include water only with your child's drink bottle.

## Sun Safe Policy

The Department of Education has a sun safe policy. This means for Term One and Term Four NO HAT NO OUTSIDE PLAY. We do permit children to play under the verandah if they have forgotten their hats. Please help us protect your child from the sun by ensuring they have an appropriate sun safe hat and applying sunscreen before they come to school.

## Birthdays

You are welcome to bring in a small treat to celebrate your child's birthday in class. We can help to hand out these treats such as cupcakes and freddo frogs to their classmates. Please do not send in treats that require cutting such as a whole cake.

Although we do not have a "no nut policy" we do have students who have nut allergies and as such, we ask families to be mindful of that when packing lunches.



# STARTING SCHOOL

## What to bring to school

- A school bag large enough for paintings, work and their lunchbox.
- Crunch n' Sip, Recess and Lunch
- A hat for Term One and Term Four.
- A spare change of clothes including underwear to be kept in their school bag.
- A pair of shoes that the child can manage independently. If shoes have laces, the child needs to be able to do them up.

## Toys

Please do not allow your child to bring toys to school. We cannot be responsible for loss or damage.



# ATTENDANCE, ILLNESSES AND ABSENCES

## Reporting Absences

If your child is absent from school, you can either contact the school on 9776 5800 or contact your child's teacher through Dojo. If an absence is not recorded by 10am, an automated message will be sent to advise you.

If your child is late, or needs to leave school early please sign your child in/ out at the front office.

## Medication

If your child needs medication, please inform the classroom teacher or the front office. Medication will not be administered unless the appropriate forms are filled in. Under no circumstances should medication be kept in your child's bag for safety reasons.







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
